Suitable for ages: Grades 5-12

Instructions

What you will need checklist:

- Materials of your choice to create your work of art (pens, paints, pencils it's up to you!)
- Data for an issue of your choosing (e.g. population of caribou over time, global temperatures, population of Calgary).

Instructions:

- 1. Choose a topic what story do you want to communicate?
- 2. Search for data. For example, if you are researching the growth of Calgary, you might look for the population of Calgary over time.
- 3. Plan how to share your story. Try creating a graph to display your data and think about how you can incorporate this into your work of art.


